## TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

In 2011 the Borough undertook the process of finding, refurbishing, and reinstalling historic Keystone Markers at the edges of the community. With guidance and assistance from the Keystone Marker Trust, three original markers were successfully reinstalled during a rededication ceremony held on October 4, 2012.

I have worked closely with Nathaniel Guest and Jack Graham, representatives of the Keystone Marker Trust, throughout this project. These gentlemen proved to be a great source of technical expertise and assistance providing consultation on appropriate paint colors and helping determine the safest locations for reinstallation of the markers. Two markers were currently in our possession. The third marker, in a highly deteriorated state, was discovered on private property on a cul-de-sac in a neighboring township. The Trust played an integral role in the Borough's efforts to reacquire this sign, which Jack carefully repaired and renovated before presenting it for the rededication ceremony.

With the help of the Keystone Marker Trust, all three signs received a much-needed facelift and are now prominently displayed at major entrances to the Borough. I would highly recommend any entity contemplating renovation and preservation of these historic markers work closely with the Keystone Marker Trust and take advantage of its experience and guidance in insuring the historical integrity of these important symbols from our past.
